
I have discussed how things will operate in each school with the senior teachers and they have asked me to share the following information with you:

Kelling - there will be no more operating in bubbles at the school, so all of the children will be free to mix together as they did before the COVID outbreak. Please continue to drop your children off at the gate (not the playground) at 8.30 each morning. In the afternoons, pupils can be collected from the playground at 3.10.

Blakeney - Drop off in the morning is from 8.30 to 8.45. Please wait on the bottom playground to collect your children at 3.15

Hindringham - Please drop pupils off in the morning at the front gate at 8.30. The pupils will be brought out to you at 3.15 so please wait on the pavement as you were doing last term.

Walsingham - Please drop pupils off between 8.30 and 8.45 onto the playground and they can be collected from the gate at 3.15 - the staff will bring the children out to you there.

PE

On days when the pupils have PE lessons, please can they wear their PE kit into school. School staff will let you know which days each class have PE.

Active Education sessions will resume next term - Monday: Blakeney, Tuesday: Walsingham, Wednesday: Hindringham, Thursday: Kelling.

Attendance

The Local Authority requires us to send out to you all the attached letter regarding pupils' attendance at school. Putting it simply, Headteachers can only approve absence from school in "exceptional" circumstances. Hopefully the attendance letter gives you all of the information you need with regards to this, but please do feel free to let me know if you would like to discuss this in further detail with me.
